Jolene cares for a variety of chicken breeds including Rhode Island Reds, Easter Eggers, and show bird quality chickens from France bred in the Ukraine. Jolene describes her chickens as "great pets" who sometimes wander through open doors into the house! She delights in describing the myriad of egg colors her hens produce including pink, blue, green, maroon, brown, and shades of green and lavender. ### **EXPANSION FUNDS:**

- DDS statewide Family Supports received \$7 million in Expansion Funds for this fiscal year 2022 (7/1/21-6/30/22). The Springfield/Westfield DDS office is using a portion of the funding to create two new programs at MCS. The first is a part-time Navigator who will work exclusively with families in the Hilltowns to address the unique challenges families in that area face.
- The second program is Adult IFFS, also known as Intensive Flexible Family Supports. This program will serve as wrap around supports for families who are caring for a disabled adult family member in their home who are experiencing serious challenges. These circumstances can be directly related to the disability or indirectly related and causing severe stress for the family and/or putting the disabled adult at risk of needing out-of- home placement. Adult IFFS provides case management, behavioral supports, and flexible funding to ease the level of stress and help them continue to care for their disabled adult family member in their home.
