# GROUPRESPITE

Group respite offers our consumers the opportunity to enjoy activities with their friends while providing respite for caregivers. The group leaders work hard to provide a variety of activities designed to meet the interests of all participants. Activities range from less active, such as arts & crafts, to more daring, such as zip lining. It's important to remember that these groups are designed for people who enjoy social outings with multiple participants and who can function safely and appropriately in a group setting. Participants should be able to attend to the majority of their needs (bathroom, eating, walking) without 1:1 dedicated assistance. MCS currently hosts 10 separate groups. ## Grandparent's Network

MCS has hosted the Grandparent's Network since 2000. This is a network of grandparents who are the primary caregivers for grandchildren with developmental disabilities. The Network provides grandparents the opportunity to get together to share experiences, provide support to one another, and address challenges as they advocate for their grandchildren's needs. The Network meets on a monthly basis, usually the 3rd Thursday. With the input of the group, the program coordinator develops a plan for the year's activities that may include trainings, educational forums, and/or opportunities for social and recreational activities. The coordinator also provides information and referral services as requested. Given that there are a number of grandparents whose primary language is Spanish; the project's Coordinator is bilingual. The Coordinator can arrange interpreters for other languages. Transportation is provided to those in need. A light lunch is provided for meetings, speaker series, and trainings.
